





Forensic Evaluation Services, Resolution No. 145213

A.) LSUHSC-N.O., Department of Psychiatry, agrees to provide boarded and certified, licensed Psychiatrist(s)/Clinical Psychologist(s) to provide forensic evaluations, when such is ordered by the 24th Judicial District and Jefferson Parish Courts; whereas such services may be provided via tele-medicine and tele-testimony, as needed and mutually agreed upon. Should psychometric testing be ordered; this would be completed at University designated location.

In addition to its responsibilities set forth in the Scope of Services and for the consideration set forth herein, LSUHSC-N.O. shall integrate education on behalf of Psychiatry Residents and Fellows rotating in the Department of Psychiatry, in accordance with the terms set forth herein. It is mutually agreed that Residents and Fellows rotating will not attend court hearings.

1. Duties of Residents and Fellows

All Residents and Fellows will participate in accordance with the highest standards of the medical profession, will conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the principles of medical ethics of the American Medical Association, and will comply with Medical Staff Bylaws, rules, regulations, and policies of the 24th Judicial District and Jefferson Parish Courts.
