Students who struggle with phonemic awareness and phonics early on are more likely to have reading difficulties later (Melby-Lervag, Lyster, Hulme, 2012). Dr. Heidi Mesmer explains that accurate reading comprises two types of words: high-frequency and decodable. Our books focus on highly decodable words while including the much-needed high-frequency words to help students become more accurate readers as they learn to distinguish between the two types of words. The Just Right Reader phonics progression starts with letter books that have been expertly written to help students recognize alphabet letters as well as write them with ease, part of a multi-componential alphabet instruction that has been backed by Dr. Ray Reutzel and continued research (Piasta & Wagnet, 2010).

As a result, Just Right Reader's decodables and lessons feature strong lesson-to-text match and other text features that enhance decodability (Mesmer, 2022).

Just Right Reader's robust Scope and Sequence support the development of phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension skills. The high volume of titles in the Just Right Reader Library gives students ample opportunity to practice decoding new and previously taught sound-spelling patterns in context, which research demonstrates promotes orthographic mapping and reading comprehension.

We know the importance of teacher knowledge and practice. To that end, Just Right Reader frequently hosts virtual and in-person Symposiums to connect educators with top reading researchers, including Dr. Heidi Mesmer, Dr. Lucy Paulson, and Dr. Ray Reutzel.

Phonemic Awareness
(5 minutes)

1. Use picture cards to sort

Say: Today we will sort pictures by beginning sound. Some will begin with the sound /l/ and some will begin with the sound /n/.

Make a t-chart with "l" on one side and "n" on the other. Choose 3-5 picture cards that begin with /l/ and 3-5 that begin with /n/. (Possible pictures: igloo, insect, inch, iguana, nail, nut, noodles, nest)

Hold up a card, say the name of the picture, and have students repeat it.

Say: Does this begin with /l/ or /n/?

Place the card under the corresponding column on your t-chart. Students take turns until all pictures have been sorted.

Phonics Review
(5 minutes)

1. Review the letter l

Say: Remember that the letter l makes the /l/ sound. (Show the letter l card.) The uppercase l has a big line down, little line top, little line bottom. The lowercase l starts with a little line down, then has a dot.

2. Match letters to a letter/sound chart

Give each student a bag of letters. Students pull one letter at a time and match it to the corresponding letter on the letter/sound chart. Ask students to say the name of the letter and its sound as they put the letter on the chart.

When two letters come together to make one sound, it is called a digraph. In words with a digraph, there are more letters than sounds, like in /ch/ /oi/ /p/.

Phonics Review: Digraph ch/tch
(5 minutes)

1. Introduction

Say: Ch is a consonant digraph. When c and h come together they make one sound /ch/. There is a second way to make the /ch/ sound. (Show tch on a card.) We can use **digraph tch**. A digraph is when three letters come together to make one sound. Tch says /ch/. Tch is always at the end of a word or syllable. Usually tch is used if the vowel is short a or short e. If you hear the /ch/ at the beginning of a word it is spelled ch.

2. Use word cards to read words

Say: I am going to show you a word card. I want you to silently decode the word. When I say go, you say the word.

2. Use Elkonin boxes to make words

Say: We are going to use our Elkonin boxes and letter tiles. Push the tiles to make the word rich. Rich has four letters but only three sounds because the ch makes one sound. The ch goes in one box. Choose 2-3 words for students to make with the Elkonin boxes.

"Rich, can you check on the chickens?"

Rich nods, "Yes," as he has his fish and chips. He will check on the chickens in the pen.

Intentional Design

We leverage decades of reading research to inform our methods and materials. Our methodology is deeply rooted in the science of reading, and we prioritize foundational skills essential for early literacy development. Our [Logic Model](#) outlines Just Right Reader's approach to equipping students for short and long term reading success and the research citations that underpin what we do (See pages 13-14).

Phonemic awareness is pivotal in the early stages of reading development. Just Right Reader Decodables are designed to enhance this skill, enabling students to decode words effortlessly. Our books are designed to have text in a large font and the remaining blank space so that students can easily focus on the words. Twenty percent of the words on each page are the focus skill words. The left page of each book spread includes the focus skill words, previously taught skills, and high-frequency words. The right page contains the art to help students gain meaning.

Every layer of our design process works to eliminate experience disparities that affect students' access to equitable educational materials free from bias. From the authors and illustrators to our team of editors, our decodable books go through rigorous editing stages to ensure equity in literacy. Imagine the number of books students practice weekly in school or at home. Imagine the power of students seeing themselves represented in all those books daily. Just Right Reader is committed to creating this reality for students.

Sequential Scope and Sequence

Our phonics progression guides students from basic alphabet recognition and early decoding skills through complex sound-spelling patterns and multisyllabic word reading. Whether students are ready to decode CVC words, vowel teams, or multisyllabic words with affixes, we can meet them with "just right" instruction and practice. Just Right Reader provides multiple decodables for each critical phonics skill (e.g., vowel sound-spelling patterns) to give students the repeated exposure they need to orthographically map known words.

With more than 700 available decodable titles, Just Right Reader's program allows students to practice previously learned words and sound-spelling patterns to automaticity at every grade level. Each Set of decodables includes multiple titles focused on the target skill, and previously learned skills are incorporated into future decodables to provide additional opportunities to practice. For example, Set 37 in our Second Grade library focuses on the digraphs *-ea* and *-igh*. Six titles are dedicated to this target skill, and the digraphs *-ea* and *-igh* appear in decodables in Sets 38-58.

Just Right Reader’s program is cumulative. After an explicit introduction, each phonics pattern is spiraled through our instructional progression to provide interleaved practice of new and previously learned skills.

Decodables Grounded in Research


Research reveals that decodable text significantly affects beginning reading skills. The positive impact of this teaching method is measurable through standardized assessments, such as the Woodcock Reading Mastery Test, as well as more informal phonics, spelling, and reading aptitude instruments. In addition to reading practice with decodable text, phonics instruction also positively impacts spelling ability, demonstrated in students’ independent writing. Using controlled text as an alternative to traditional trade literature for phonics lesson follow-up is preferable for getting young children off to the best start in learning to read. Furthermore, the results indicate that children gain self-confidence, leading to reading enjoyment. Thus, decodable texts can be engaging and motivating for students. Most importantly, the evidence suggests they make a significant difference in teaching young children to read. (Sadlier School Professional Development Series, A Research Study on the Effects of Using Decodable Texts with Systematic Phonics Instruction. Blevins, 2019.)

Our decodables provide an authentic and rigorous learning experience that engages the reader to relate to the content and become motivated to read. With books progressing across a phonics continuum, students read within a challenging and engaging range. Our fiction books have interesting stories students relate to, and our non-fiction books break down abstract concepts while providing real-life, everyday examples.

Our proprietary assessment matching algorithm currently supports more than 15 commonly used ELA assessments and phonics inventories, including 95% Group Phonics Screener for Intervention (PSI), Acadience (Dibels Next), Dibels 8th Edition, iReady, NWEA MAP, PALS, Renaissance STAR Reading, and others!

After receiving student reading data, we send each student a gift-wrapped pack of **10 engaging decodables** focused on the target phonics skill or skills the student needs to practice. Each Pack also includes writing pages and research-based reading activities that encourage repeated reading, and we give schools using customized Take-Home Decodable Packs information about which students are working on the same skills.



With more than 400 titles in our English Decodables collection, we enable schools to provide summer practice that matches each student’s needs, and most of our titles are **more than 90% decodable** using previously learned sound-spelling patterns. Our Take-Home Decodables give students opportunities to read stories with previously learned phonics patterns, which supports the process of orthographic mapping and allows students to experience reading success. 

During the 2021-22 and 2022-23 school years, [Fulton County Schools](#) reduced the number of turnaround schools from 11 to 4 and increased the percentage of grade 3-5 students in turnaround schools reading at or above grade level by 2.3% using our Classroom Libraries and Take-Home Decodable Packs.



Similarly, during our Take-Home Pilot Program, [Mitchell Elementary](#) in Houston, TX used our Take-Home Decodable Packs to provide daily intervention to 40 students reading two or more years below grade level. The results are exciting! More than 75% of students in the pilot made positive gains, and more than 25% met their goal of one-year's worth of growth before their mid-year assessments.
