BIDS ON GRADER BLADES

Sealed bids are invited and will be received by the Administrative Office of the Acadia Parish Police Jury, State of Louisiana, until **Wednesday, June 21, 2023, at 10:30 A.M.**, in the Office of the Police Jury, **505 N.E. Court Circle, Administrative Office Building**, Crowley, Louisiana, for the purchase of the grader blade requirements of the Parish. Bids to be for a period beginning August 1, 2023 through January 31, 2024. Blades are to be delivered by successful bidder to the Acadia Parish Crowley Barn, Roller Road, upon receipt of a purchase order from the Acadia Parish Police Jury.

SPECIFICATIONS:

Blades are to be made from the highest grades of open-hearth steel. The standard curved sections, such as 6' x 1/2" x 8' x 5/8" have edges and curvations rolled at the mills to insure uniformity. Blades are not reheated, formed and pressed. All blades are to be manufactured under carefully controlled certified analysis as follows:

Carbon	.08	1.00
Manganese	.06	.90
Sulphur	.05 Max.	
Phosphorus	.05 Max.	
Silicon	.30 Max.	
Brinell Hardness	230 to 235	

Bidder must submit a signed statement that all blades meet or exceed the above specifications.



HARDNESS VALUE & COMPOSITION

Heat Treated Steels

All Black Cat Heat Treated grader and snow blades are manufactured from high alloy Boron steel and through hardened to a hardness specification of 410 to 512 Brinell (44-52 HRC). The chemical composition is as follows (in weight %):

Element	1/2" to 3/4"	1" & over
Carbon (C)	0.28 - 0.32	0.28 to 0.36
Manganese (Mn)	0.80 - 1.10	1.10 to 1.45
Sulphur (S)	0.05 maximum	0.05 maximum
Phosphorous (P)	0.04 maximum	0.04 maximum
Silicon (Si)	0.15 - 0.35	0.15 - 0.35
Boron (B)	0.0005 - 0.0080	0.0005 - 0.0080

High Carbon Steels

All Black Cat High Carbon grader and snow plow blades are manufactured with nominal as rolled hardness values of 271 to 301 Brinell (28-32 HRC).

The chemical composition is as follows (in weight %):

Element	1/2" to 3/4"
Carbon (C)	0.80 - 0.84
Manganese (Mn)	0.60 - 0.75
Sulphur (S)	0.05 maximum
Phosphorous (P)	0.04 maximum
Silicon (Si)	0.15 - 0.30

At Black Cat Wear Parts the hardness is measured in the Brinell Scale, the Rockwell value is a conversion using SAE conversion tables.

General Instructions

Purpose of Form

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

- Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)

- Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
- Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
